



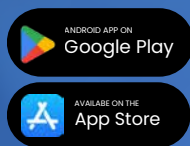

## KARIBU TANZANIA

### *Africa's Leading Safari Destination*

Tanzania does not ask to be Africa's leading safari destination. The evidence simply leads there. More than 25% of its land is protected, 21 national parks, 7 UNESCO World Heritage Sites, and millions of square kilometres of wilderness that belongs, first and foremost, to the wild.

Visit the Serengeti, where over 1.5 million wildebeest, zebra, and antelope move across the plains in the Great Migration, the largest overland movement of animals on the planet. Descend into the Ngorongoro Crater, a natural amphitheatre where Africa's Big 5 roam within the walls of an ancient volcano. Scale the heights of Mount Kilimanjaro (the Roof of Africa), the highest free-standing mountain in the world. To reach the summit, trekkers pass through 5 distinct ecological zones, from tropical rainforest to arctic ice, a journey that feels like crossing an entire continent on foot.

Tanzania saves its most seductive chapter for last: Zanzibar, the Indian Ocean archipelago that sits just 40km off the coast. Stone Town, its UNESCO-listed historic heart has woven together African, Arab, Indian, & European cultures into it's streets. Beyond Stone Town, Zanzibar boasts white-sandy beaches that stretch along calm turquoise waters, world-class diving & snorkeling spots, spice farms, Jozani forest tour and more.

Most visitors arrive in Zanzibar after a mainland safari. The combination of raw wilderness of the Serengeti followed by the warm, ocean breeze of Zanzibar, is one of the great travel pairings in the world. In October 2025, Tanzania earned USD 4.2 billion in tourism revenue, the highest in the country's history. The world is not discovering Tanzania, it's returning to it.



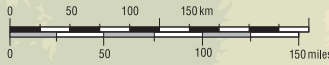

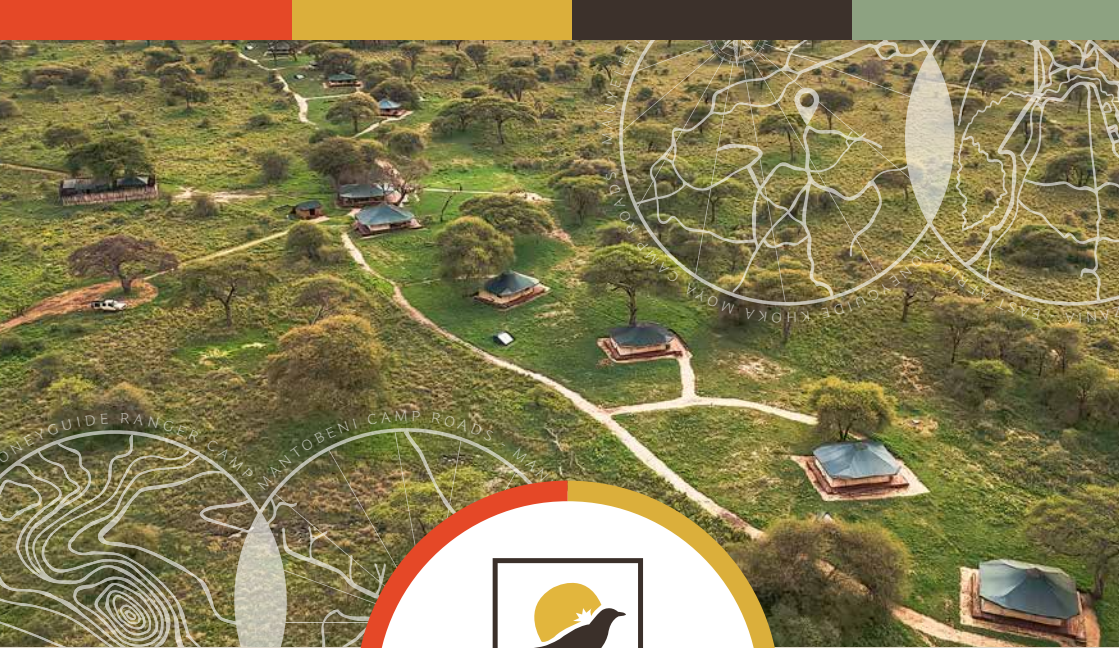
### **Arusha National Park**

Tanzania's most accessible wilderness sits minutes from Arusha city. Within one compact park: the jagged crater of Mount Meru, the glassy Momella Lakes, the forested walls of Ngurdoto Crater, and black-and-white colobus monkeys leaping through the canopy above you. Arusha National Park is where the safari begins, sometimes before you have even unpacked.

### **Lake Manyara National Park**

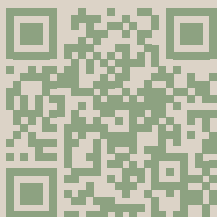

Mkomazi is Tanzania's wilderness without the crowds. This is vast and largely undiscovered reserve sits at the foot of Mount Kilimanjaro's southern slopes, a dramatic backdrop that few safari-goers ever see. Mkomazi is home to critically endangered black rhino and African wild dog, two of Africa's rarest animals.



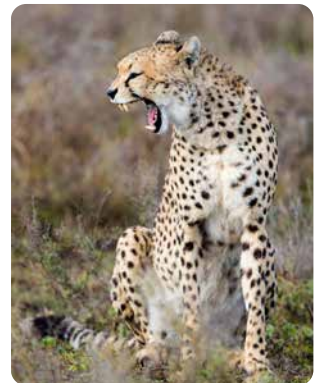
## Tarangire National Park

Just 120 kilometres from Arusha, Tarangire is Tanzania's best-kept safari secret. The park takes its name from the river that runs through its heart, and from June to September, that river becomes the lifeline of the savannah. Thousands of elephant, buffalo, giraffe, and wildebeest converge on its banks as the dry season tightens its grip. Ancient baobab trees tower over the landscape like silent witnesses. Tarangire rewards those who look beyond the famous parks. Come here for the wildlife. Stay for the atmosphere.



## Serengeti National Park

The Serengeti is where Africa's greatest wildlife drama unfolds. Its name means "endless plains" in Maasai, and endless is exactly what it feels like. Home to over 3 million large mammals, the park hosts the Great Migration every year, when vast herds of wildebeest and zebra move across the savannah, closely followed by lions, leopards, cheetahs, hyenas, and jackals. Above it all, over 500 bird species fill the sky. Whatever you expect from Africa, the Serengeti will exceed it.

### *Largest National Parks of Africa*

Escape the crowds and venture into Tanzania's lesser-known southern parks, where pristine wilderness and abundant wildlife await.

#### **Mikumi National Park**

The Mikumi flood plain, with its open grasslands, dominates the park together with the mountain ranges that border the park on two sides. Elephants are commonly seen and other animals frequently observed are buffalo, civet, eland, giraffe, impala, kudu, reed-buck, warthog, waterbuck, wildebeest, zebra and Lichtenstein's hartebeest.

#### **Nyerere National Park**

The 2019 established park is part of the Selous Game Reserve and covers an area of over 30,000 sq km. Nyerere is now the largest national park in Africa. The Rufiji River delta is an important eco-system and attracts numerous of wildlife.

#### **Ruaha National Park**

Ruaha is rich of plants and animals which can't be found in any other national park, such as Greater Kudu, Sable and Roan Antelopes. The Great Ruaha River is the heart of the park, it is habitat of hippopotamus and massive crocodiles.

#### **Udzungwa Mountains National Park**

Udzungwa Mountains National Park is a conservation area of about 2,000 sq km. It lies in the Iringa and Morogoro regions of south-central Tanzania where it is bordered by the Great Ruaha River to the north and by the road between Mikumu and Ifakara to the east.

## WESTERN SAFARI CIRCUIT

### *Untouched Wilderness*

The most untouched national parks are located in the western part of Tanzania along Lake Tanganyika – the World’s longest, second deepest and least polluted freshwater lake – harboring an estimated 1000 fish species.

#### **Gombe Stream National Park**

A mountainous strip bordering the shores of Lake Tanganyika, 16 km north of Kigoma. Gombe is currently Tanzania’s smallest park. It covers just 56 sq km and is only reachable by boat from Kigoma. Gombe offers visitors the rare chance to observe the chimpanzee communities made famous by British explorer Jane Goodall. The area is heavily forested making it unsuitable for carnivores and safe for walking. Birdwatchers will be richly rewarded.

#### **Katavi National Park**

Katavi National Park, Tanzania’s third-largest park at around 4,500 sq km, is situated approximately 40 km southeast of Mpanda. It features Lake Katavi with vast floodplains and the meandering Katuma River. With over 450 bird species and a high concentration of hippos and crocodiles, it showcases Tanzania’s rich ecosystems.

#### **Mahale National Park**

The park, like its northerly neighbor Gombe, is home to some of Africa’s last remaining wild chimpanzees, a population of roughly 900. They are habituated to human visitors by a Japanese research project founded in the 1960s. Tracking the chimps of Mahale is a magical experience. The park is explored on foot as there are no roads or other infrastructure within the park boundaries.

# NGORONGORO

## *World Heritage Site*

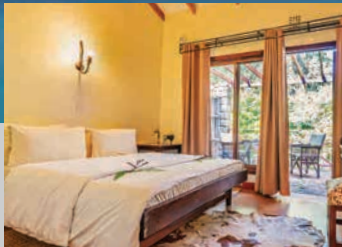
Ngorongoro Conservation Area is a Protected Area and a Mixed World Heritage Site located 177km west of Arusha, in the Northern Tanzania. The Ngorongoro Conservation Area covering 8,292 square kilometers is home to Ngorongoro Crater, Ndotu, Empakai Crater, Olmoti Crater, Olduvai Gorge, Olkarien Gorge, Shifting Sand, Laetoli Footprints, Nasera Rock, Northern highland forest reserve with Endoro Waterfalls and Elephants Caves.

The Ngorongoro Conservation Area was established in 1959 under the ordinance cap no 413 to promote indigenous residents' interests, conservation of natural resources, and tourism promotion. The 1959 ordinance also created the Ngorongoro Conservation Area Authority, an administrative body to manage the Area as a parastatal organization. The authority is under the supervision of the Ministry of Natural Resources and Tourism (MNRT).

The Ngorongoro Conservation Area is a unique multiple-land-use area with wildlife coexisting with semi-nomadic Maasai pastoralists practicing traditional livestock grazing in Tanzania. The Maasai are a pastoral tribe that has managed to preserve its culture for hundreds of years, living in harmony with wild animals.

Therefore, The NCA was established as an experiment to balance pastoralism, conservation, and tourism. The multiple land use policy has made the Ngorongoro Conservation Area a unique Protected Area in the World. The Natural and cultural endowment account for the reasons UNESCO accorded the Area the status of a World Heritage Site in 1979 and an International Biosphere Reserve in 1981.



In 2010, UNESCO inscribed Ngorongoro Conservation Area as a property in the list of Mixed World Heritage Sites, since 2013 Ngorongoro Crater is among Africa's New Seven Natural Wonders. Ngorongoro has another UNESCO recognition, gained in 2018: it is part of a large geographical area in Northern Tanzania recognized as Ngorongoro-Lengai UNESCO Global Geopark.



## Geopark

According to UNESCO, global geoparks are single, unified geographical areas where sites and landscapes of international geological significance are managed with a holistic concept of protection, education and sustainable development. Multiple land use Ngorongoro Conservation Area is the only place in the world where people live in harmony with wildlife.

The annual wildebeest migration occurs in both the Ngorongoro Conservation Area and Serengeti National Park. The calving season for wildebeests is between February and March every year and is accompanied by other animals. Tens of thousands of zebras and gazelles accompanying the wildebeests, take advantage of safety in numbers to drop their young.

A visit to Ngorongoro during this time of the year allows you to see thousands of wildebeests and their babies, along with the herds of zebras that accompany them. The abundance of young prey also attracts lions, leopards, hyenas, cheetahs, and other predators.

Other attractions in the Ngorongoro area are the Ngorongoro crater, Olduvai Gorge, Laetoli, Empakai, and Olmoti craters, shifting sand, Nasera rock, and Olkarien Gorge. The world-famous Ngorongoro crater is a caldera and is a natural wonder. The caldera floor offers a mixture of habitats - wide savannah, woods, marsh, dry Salt Lake, forest, desert, lake, rivers, and rainforest, all in a relatively small area

The caldera has close to 30,000 different wild animals and birds: wildebeests, Thompson's and Grant's gazelles, impalas, zebras, elephants, buffalos, hyenas, jackals, lions, leopards, hippos, black rhinos and a wide variety of birds.

Wild animals are easily visible and remain there year-round. You can learn about Maasai lifestyles and traditions at cultural bomas in Ngorongoro. Maasai are proud nomadic warriors who count their wealth on cattle and children. Visit Ngorongoro for More Wild animals and attractions.

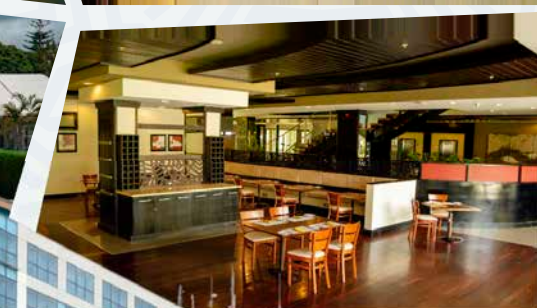

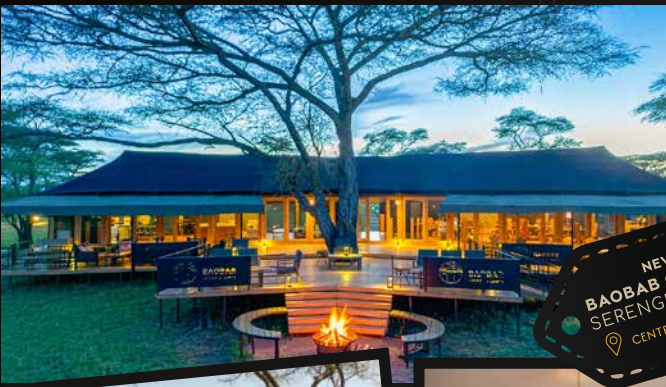

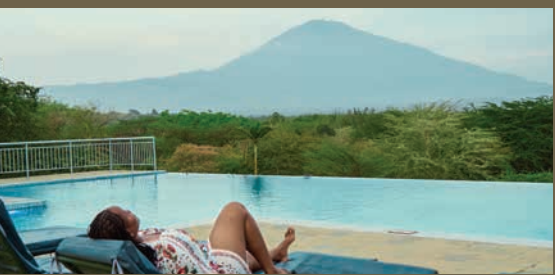

## MOUNT KILIMANJARO

### *The Roof of Africa*

Africa's highest mountain does not announce itself gently. Mount Kilimanjaro rises 5,895 meters from the surrounding plains, a lone, snow-capped giant standing at the edge of the equator, visible from hundreds of kilometers away. It is the highest free-standing mountain in the world, and one of the Seven Summits. Yet remarkably, reaching its peak demands no specialist mountaineering skill. If you can walk steadily and breathe slowly, Kilimanjaro is within your reach.

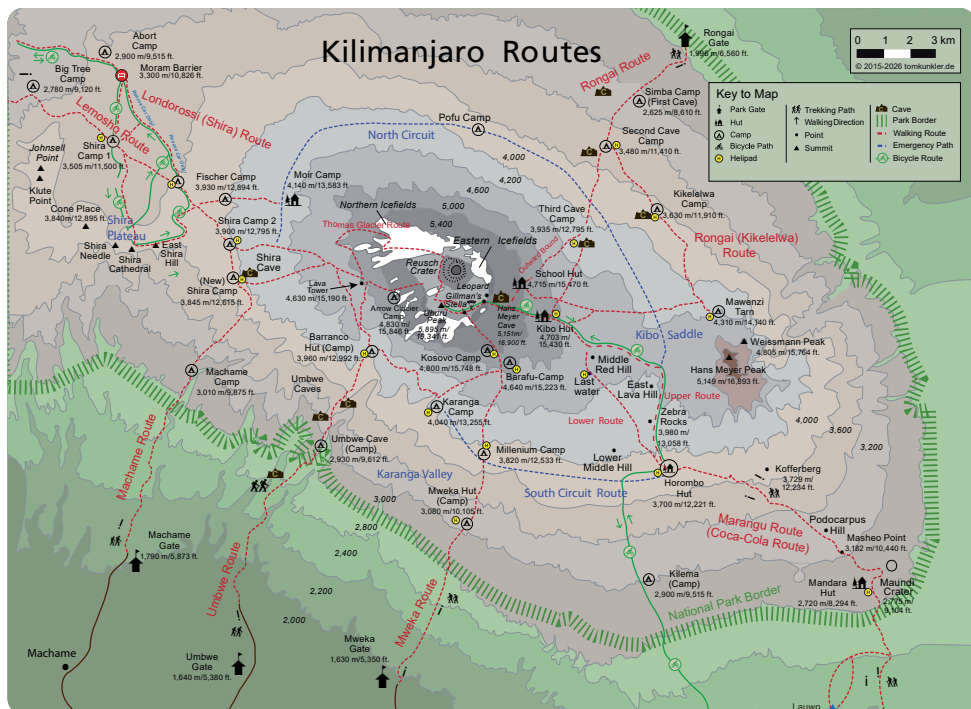
The climb is as much about the journey as the summit. Ascending through five distinct ecological zones in just a few days, trekkers move from lush rain forest alive with birdsong, through heathered moorlands dotted with giant lobelia and ancient groundsel trees, across a stark alpine desert, and finally onto the arctic ice fields that crown Uhuru Peak. Each zone feels like a different continent. The mountain does not repeat itself.



The 7 established routes offer different experiences of the ascent, Machame for scenery, Lemosho for solitude, Marangu for comfort with mountain hut accommodation along the way. Most climbs take between 6 - 9 days, with longer routes offering better acclimatisation and higher summit success rates.

Expert guides accompany every climb, and the best time to attempt the summit is during the dry seasons: January to March, and August to October. At Uhuru Peak, the true summit, the plains of Tanzania stretch to the horizon 5,895 meters below you. The silence is absolute. The achievement is personal. This is why people come and why they never forget it

### *Meet the People*

Tanzania's wildlife will take your breath away. Its people will make you want to stay. Cultural tourism is the most overlooked experience on any Tanzania safari itinerary, and the most rewarding one to add. Across around 60 community-led programs nationwide, visitors can walk with Maasai warriors, learn ancient craft traditions at the foot of Mount Kilimanjaro, cook Swahili coastal cuisine rich with coconut and spice, trek the savanna on camel-back, or glide through river mangroves by canoe.

But Tanzania's most extraordinary cultural encounter belongs to the Hadzabe, one of the last true hunter-gatherer tribes on Earth, living in the remote Lake Eyasi region. Set out at dawn with Hadzabe hunters tracking game with handcrafted bows. Walk with the women foraging for wild tubers, honey, and medicinal plants, knowledge passed down thousands of years with no written record.

Spending even a few hours with them reframes everything you thought you understood about human survival and connection to nature. Wildlife shows you Tanzania's landscape. Culture reveals its soul. Add one cultural experience to your safari and you will leave understanding this country in a way no game drive alone can offer.

## *Land of Paradise*

Welcome to Zanzibar, a tropical paradise off Tanzania's coast where history meets natural beauty. This enchanting island blends pristine white-sand beaches with the aromatic spice plantations that earned it the nickname "Spice Island." In Stone Town, a UNESCO World Heritage site, narrow streets wind through ancient buildings, telling tales of sultans, slaves, and traders. Here, African, Arab, and Indian cultures create a unique tapestry of experiences.



### Zanzibar's History

Throughout centuries, Zanzibar served as a crucial trading hub between Africa, Arabia, and India. Portuguese colonizers first controlled the island in the 16th century, followed by Omani rule that established it as the center of both spice and slave trade. In 1964, after gaining independence from Britain, Zanzibar merged with Tanganyika to form modern Tanzania.

### Zanzibar's Dress Code & Culture

Dressing appropriately in Zanzibar is more than just following rules, it's a gateway to meaningful cultural experiences. The island's strong Islamic influence shapes daily life and dress codes, especially in Stone Town and villages. During Ramadhan, eating in public during the day is not permitted, to help visitors plan respectfully.





Women travelers should pack loose-fitting clothes that cover shoulders and knees. Light, flowing dresses and pants are perfect for the tropical climate. Men should avoid sleeveless shirts and very short shorts in town. Beach attire is perfectly acceptable at resorts and private beaches, but pack a light cover-up for walking through local areas.

During Ramadan, the atmosphere becomes even more traditional. Locals appreciate visitors who dress modestly and refrain from eating in public during fasting hours. This respectful approach often leads to wonderful cultural exchanges – you might find yourself invited to a traditional Swahili coffee ceremony or a family celebration, offering a genuine glimpse into Zanzibari life.

### **Pemba Island: History & Culture**

Welcome to Pemba, a mysterious island where ancient traditions still rule daily life. Unlike its bustling neighbor Zanzibar, Pemba remains wonderfully authentic, offering glimpses into untouched Swahili culture.

Known as “The Green Island” by early Arab sailors, Pemba’s story is woven with tales of seafaring traders, powerful sultans, and mystical healers. The island earned fame as the world’s leading clove producer, filling the air with sweet spice fragrances that drift through its lush forests.



Today, Pemba’s culture is a fascinating blend of African and Islamic traditions. In quiet fishing villages, skilled craftsmen build wooden dhows using techniques passed down through generations. The island is especially famous for its traditional healers and spiritual practices, many East Africans believe Pemba holds powerful magical secrets. Life here moves to the rhythm of the tides, where fishermen still navigate by the stars and community celebrations follow ancient customs, creating an enchanting escape from the modern world.
